Just comments to be added to the record:

1. No issues with the Dairy Queen spots going away.
2. Not opposed to adding the 10 minute spots, however, it needs to be made clear to the DCA Committee and the Credit Union that enforcement of these spots are random, not every day, and certainly not every 10 minutes. Often a business who asks for one of these comes away with the wrong impression that every time a car is parked there 12 or 15 minutes that we are going to be around to ticket it and force it to move. With half-time parking enforcement, it doesn't work that way. So we need to make sure to communicate back to the committee and IQ Credit Union that we will keep an eye on these during normal (random) parking enforcement rounds and do the best we can, but to be accurate – enforcement is limited. We do not respond to calls from the owner that there is a car parked in the 10 minute spot for more than 10 minutes.

We met this morning to discuss the agenda for the upcoming Parking Advisory Committee meeting on September 12th. The following items are slated for the agenda:

1. NE 4th and Birch – IQ request for two 10-minute parking spaces (please see the correspondence below.) – action item.
2. NE 3rd parking - elimination of three spaces in front of the Dairy Queen (when WSDOT paves SR-500, there will be a revision to the lane configurations at 3rd and Dallas. A designated westbound to southbound left turn lane will be installed with the through and right turn lane adjacent the north curb line.) – informational only.
3. Update on the downtown parking map ordinance – informational only.
