- WHEREAS, during the month October, let us remember those who cancer took from us too soon, and let this month be a tribute to them, their families and our medical professionals, while we recommit to the promise of finding a cure; and
- WHEREAS, we display pink ribbons and wear pink clothing for this cause, we must do all we can to ensure all people can enjoy the extraordinary gift that is a long, happy and healthy life;
