A. Jones Creek Flow Monitoring Interlocal Agreement

Details: To assist in the operation of the City's proposed slow sand water filtration plant that will be under construction in 2015 at the Headworks Property, the City will need to monitor stream flow data in either Jones Creek or Boulder Creek. Clark County has existing flow monitoring equipment in Jones Creek located upstream of the City's proposed filtration plant that they were going to remove due to budget constraints. The attached Interlocal Agreement will allow the County to continue collecting flow data from Jones Creek that will be forwarded to the City. In exchange, the City will reimburse the County for actual time worked. The annual cost is estimated to be \$4,120 which will be paid out of the Water Utility fund.

B. NUGA Sewer Alternatives Analysis Amendment No. 2

Details: The City Council approved a professional services contract with BergerABAM in September 2014 and a first amendment in October 2014 to complete an alternatives analysis and select a preferred alternative to provide sewer service to the North Urban Growth Area (NUGA). The project team has developed a draft alternatives analysis with cost estimates and work efforts for the original scoped tasks are nearing completion. A second amendment in the amount of \$19,500 is attached for consideration that will allow the project team to develop a sewer system phasing program for the preferred alternative and develop a detailed cost estimate and schedule with the goal of being able to meet the near-term needs of the development community. G. Professional Services Agreement with Lynn Wittwer, MD

H. Surplus Outdated Fire Apparatus

Details: Following the completion of the merger/contract between Camas and Washougal, the fire department finds itself with an excess of old and obsolete fire apparatus that are expensive to maintain. Additionally, few meet current minimum safety standards. After consultation with command staff, the department is recommending the following vehicles be declared surplus: 1998 ALF ladder truck, 1988 Seagraves pumper, and a 1978 Mack pumper. The department is recommending use of a national advertiser to list the vehicles for sale. At this time we have no way of knowing the amount of revenue the sale of these vehicles will bring in to the department. Presenter: Nick Swinhart
