IV. WORKSHOP TOPICS

A. Steigerwald Water Source Development Utilities Cooperation Agreement Details: Staff and attorneys from the cities of Camas and Washougal and the Port of Camas-Washougal (Port) have been working together regarding the acquisition of property from the Port for future development of a new water source to serve the communities for the 50-year planning horizon. Staff has prepared the attached memorandum for Council's information and updated them about pertinent discussions and the attached Utilities Cooperation Agreement.

B. Water and Sewer Systems Rate Analysis Update

Details: Staff requested that FCS Group provide the attached Scope of Services to update the city's water and sewer systems rate study that was completed in 2013. The rate study update will be used to support the decision making process of issuing revenue bonds to design and construct the sewer transmission system to serve the North Urban Growth Area (NUGA). Additionally, the rate study update will be used to incorporate the latest funding assumptions to complete construction of the Jones and Boulder Creek Surface Water Treatment Plant and Transmission Main project. There is no intent to increase the rates, just to verify that the revenues will support the current capital program and to make any adjustments to the capital program that may be necessary. C. Sanitary Sewer Infiltration and Inflow Study Proposal

Details: Gray and Osborne, Inc. has submitted a proposal for completing an Infiltration and Inflow Study for the City of Camas sewer collection system. This study is required by Condition S4.E of the city's draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) State Waste Discharge Permit. The cost of the proposal is \$125,000 and is included in the 2015 Budget.

E. 2035 Comprehensive Plan Update

Details: During the visioning process of the 2035 Comprehensive Plan Update, which began in July 2014, many residents voiced their desire that the entrances to the city be welcoming and identifiable. Staff are working to identify gateways and gateway elements such as signage, lighting, sidewalks and crosswalks that will distinguish Camas from neighboring cities. These gateways will be further developed through Comprehensive Plan policy updates, which are an important next step in translating the Camas Vision into a roadmap for the future. The draft map of city gateways was provided for discussion, which was developed through the work of the Technical Advisory Committee. Presenter: Sarah Fox, Senior Planner

Hogan said he attended the Birch Street Uptown Lounge expansion ribbon-cutting on First Friday, July 3, 2015. He commented on the fireworks season and Ron Schumacher, Division Chief/Fire Marshal, provided additional information. Hogan commented on the Steigerwald Water Source Development Utilities Cooperation Agreement.

Turk commented on the Green Mountain Subdivision Planned Residential Development (PRD) and Phil Bourquin, Community Development Director, provided additional information. Turk commented about serving on the Camas City Council and about the July 26, 2015 Ducky Derby.

Mayor Higgins reminded everyone about the Tuesday evening Camas Meadows Concerts for a Cause, Wednesday or Thursday evening Crown Park Concerts and the Port of Camas-Washougal's Riverside Concerts.
