



Letter: Greetings,

We, the concerned citizens of Camas and Clark County, strongly urge the Camas Planning Commission, the Camas City Council, the Camas Planning Department, and Mayor Scott Higgins to reconsider the incomplete plans for unrestrained growth in the North Urban

To protect their rural, countrified way of life and limit massive noise, traffic, and construction. To keep taxes reasonable for Camas residents.

We, the concerned citizens of Camas and Clark County, strongly urge the Camas Planning Commission, the Camas City Council, the Camas Planning Department, and Mayor Scott Higgins to reconsider the incomplete plans for unrestrained growth in the North Urban Growth Area (NUGA) known as Green Mountain. The potential building of 1700 homes, populating up to 8500 people on less than 400 acres will have a significant and detrimental effect on current residents living within a 5-10 mile radius or more of these projects. In addition, these massive residential projects will impact four entities, the City of Camas, City of Vancouver, rural Clark County and State Highway 500. Massive multi-jurisdictional projects should include stakeholders from all jurisdictions. The Green Mountain Planned Residential Development (PRD), Phase 1, was moved through the first public hearing and initially recommended even though it is encumbered by a full 75 Conditions of Approval. Of these conditions, our greatest concerns include the multi-million dollar conceptual plans to build a new gravity sewer system and/or the temporary building of two above-ground human effluent (wastewater treatment) tanks, locating and building a large reservoir for public water, and finally, the necessary widening of roads to accommodate such a large increase in the population of this area. Unfortunately, the plans for the above infrastructure improvements are either non-existent or are in the preliminary stages of development.

Therefore, we the undersigned citizens of Camas and Clark County would argue that the following advice be agreed to before any development plans go forward:

All project recommendations with more than 20 Conditions of Approval are premature and should be withdrawn from consideration.

"On Demand" or ad hoc infrastructure improvements to projects of this magnitude are bad public policy and require remedial infrastructure improvements.

All Projects that impact more than two jurisdictions require a regional planning process.
