Hello,

The public notice for the PBL hearing tomorrow says 6pm, but the city website says 4pm. I'm writing for a few reasons, but mostly to ensure the meeting is actually at 6:00, which is what the letter to the surrounding neighborhoods indicated.

I know I'm past the period to actually get this question included in the agenda (I never got a copy of the notice, until I got one via email last Friday). I'm writing because I'm hoping that the city's plan for the inevitable increased traffic through Grand Ridge/Knight's Pointe will be explicitly discussed. There is already a fairly significant speeding/stop sign running problem on Fernridge Drive and Deerfern Street. The addition of teenage drivers heading to school and school busses will undoubtedly make this worse. As the city has not finished the road above Breckenridge, we are on the only through-route up this part of the hill. What is the city's plan to calm traffic and discourage additional dangerous driving on our residential road?
