CHANGES TO REFLECT COMMUNITY NEEDS

Changes are afoot at the Camas Library! Recent usage statistics have shown that picture books are among the most-used collection in the Library, yet they have relatively little space devoted to them. What's more, the picture books are largely housed in the Storytime Room, which is unavailable to patrons during events, which is—you guessed it—every morning. Here's our plan for getting more picture books into the Library, and for making them more accessible.



The first step was finding shelf space for additional picture books. As luck would have it, there was a low-rise shelving unit the same size as an existing picture book shelf completely empty by the self-service holds. Our Public Works hero Paul Hargrave and Circulation Services Specialist John Goaring moved the unit into the Children's Room, then cleaned up the area left by years spent under an extremely heavy shelving unit. Done!

Here's the unit in its new home (right). It's displaying new books until the project is complete. It will hold all of the additional picture books that the community desires, but what about getting the picture books out of the Storytime Room? That will be trickier, but not impossible. In the Children's Room there are items that are not part of the picture book collection: board books, magazines, new books. Those can be moved to another part of the Children's Library.

Here's a free corner in the Children's Room to which we hope to move shelving from the Storytime Room. That will take care of some of those books. For others, we will utilize the shelving made empty when we move board books, magazines, and new books. We will also weed out books that have grown soiled with age, or have been loved too hard by enthusiastic preschoolers!

Here's the Storytime Room as it looks today. After moving all picture books out of this room, they will be accessible any time the Library is open. Additionally, we have long-term goals to take the shelving out completely and replace it with bench seating around the perimeter of the room, as you see under the window. More room for parents to sit, leaving more room for kids to sit on the floor (or dance around wildly—whatever's appropriate!) during storytime.
