

### Reading 1,000 Books

Exposing babies and young children to books and reading offers tremendous benefit, from building vocabulary and emotional awareness to brain and sensory development. At its most basic level, it prepares children for a lifelong love of reading, academic success, and gives the child and caregiver special time together that the child can treasure.

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is a nationwide initiative that encourages families to read 1,000 books together before a child enters kindergarten, as a way to prepare them for school. Library Associate Karen Nicholson heard about the program through her niece, who was participating in it at her local library. Karen learned more through a training. From there, she was enthusiastic to start, but she needed funding for the books that would be the rewards for the children who reached their goals.

"I spoke at the local Rotary meeting", Karen said. "I thought they would need to confer to decide if they would fund the project. It was incredible...member after member came up to me and started handing me \$20 bills."

While the Rotarians' generous donations will not fund the program indefinitely, it did raise roughly \$450, and bought enough books for the first award ceremony, which was held in September. Children who have reached their goal have a star on their part of the bookworm in the storytime room.




How to reach 1,000 books: any adult may read to the child. This includes coming to storytime! Re-reading the same book also counts.

#### **Staff Happenings**





#### patron appreciation We celebrate the end of summer WITH AN OLD-FASHIONED BARBEQUE






