Written questions for Camas Council Candidates:

- 1. Why do you want to serve on the City Council? I find that I am at a point in my life where I have more time available to commit to outside interests. I am invested in this community and I want to be proactive in maintaining the quality and livability of our city. I feel I can contribute in a positive way towards the goals of the city and the council. I am interested in new challenges and working with new people to form the best possible outcomes.
- 2. What experiences, talents, or skills would you bring to the Council and community that you would like to highlight? I have over 30 years working face to face with the public sometimes in tough situations where hard messages have to be delivered. I have many years of experience sitting on both sides of the table negotiating labor contracts for represented employees. I have operational and supervisory experience overseeing 130 plus pharmacies in multiple states. I can work collaboratively with others and I will be a good team member.
- 3. Camas, like many Washington cities, is facing a structural deficit, where expenses grow faster than revenues, due to property tax limitation measures. Explain your views on how the City of Camas should address these budgetary difficulties. Specifically, discuss actions you might encourage to balance revenues and expenditures and the impact of city services. You are limited in available options. You can raise revenue where possible, cut expenses, defer expenditures, or a combination of all of these. You can delay backfilling or not hiring open employee positions when the opportunity arises while respecting existing labor contracts. Deferring projects saves money in the short term but the project costs will likely rise in the future. The city could consider \$20 dollar license tab fees as a source of revenue for road repairs. The city could consider levies with a sunset date to raise revenue for specific projects. This process would allow taxpayers to have direct input of projects and expenditures while also involving them in the government process.
- 4. In your opinion, excluding finances, what are the most significant challenges facing the City of Camas today? How would you propose to address these challenges? The biggest challenges facing the city are quality growth while also maintaining the level of services we enjoy currently in this city. We need to ensure that we have affordable housing for all income levels. I would propose that there is ratios of low, middle, and high income housing available so everyone has a chance to live and thrive in Camas. We need to grow or else we are dying but it needs to be responsible and reasonable growth that doesn't overwhelm city services.
- 5. What forms of public service or volunteering have you been involved in?

- Provide details regarding the dates, roles, and responsibilities. I served as president of our homeowners association for the Oakridge Estates for 11 years from 2003 until 2014. I was an adult volunteer for Boy Scouts Troop 565 in Camas during the years my son worked to become an Eagle Scout.
- 6. What other elected bodies have you sought a seat on or been elected to? Provide details regarding the dates, organization/agency name, and responsibilities. I am currently serving as a member at large on the Executive Board for The Guild for Professional Pharmacists in Woodland Hills California. I am a member of the Kaiser Permanente Pharmacy Labor Management Committee for 3 years now. I also serve as a union steward for my fellow pharmacists represented by the Guild for Professional Pharmacists. I also represent these pharmacists as a negotiating committee member for the last 5 contracts over the last 15 years.
