

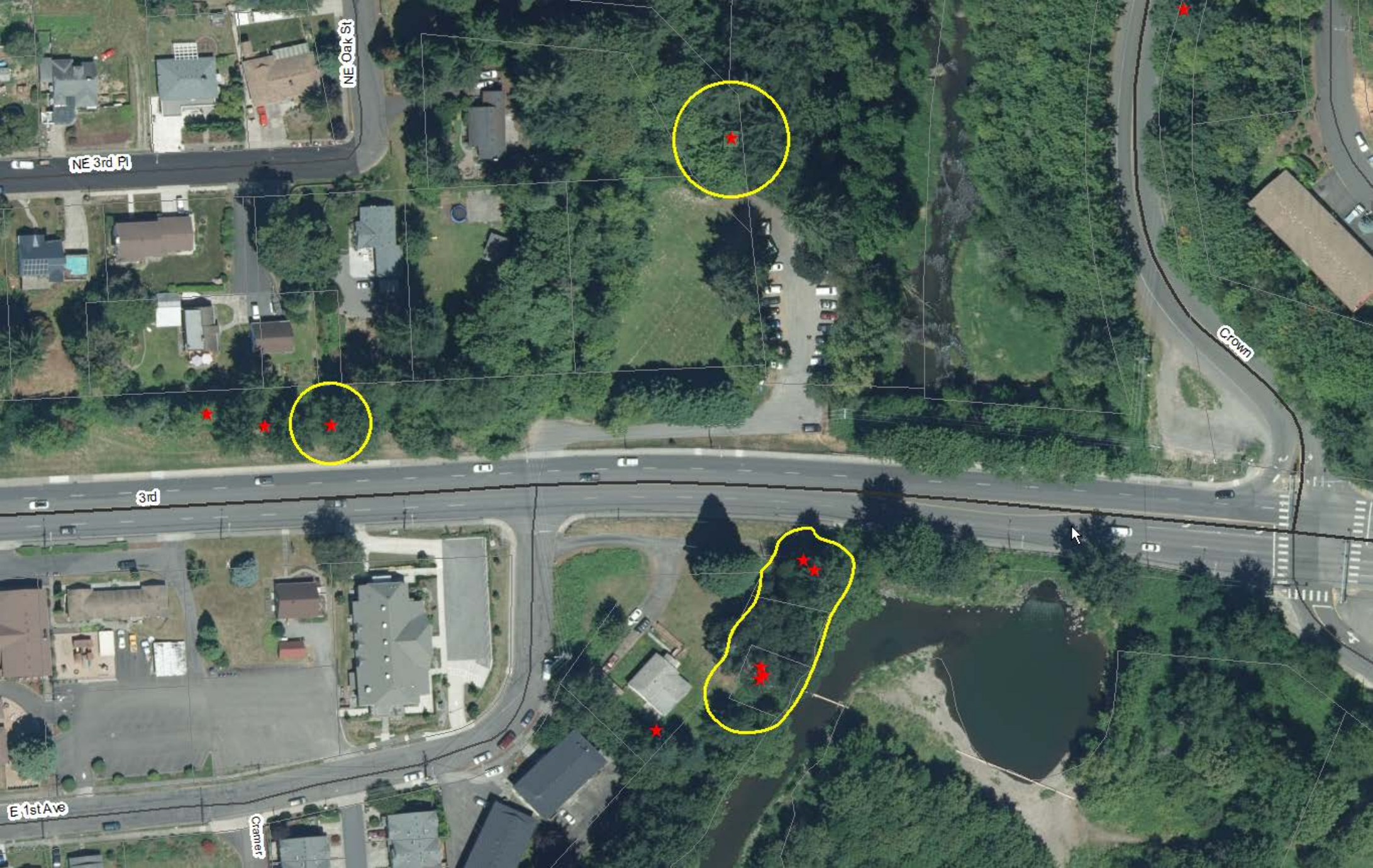

Hello,

The proposed project is within the boundary of a class 'A' noxious weed infestation of Garlic Mustard (*Alliaria petiolata*). Currently Clark County is controlling all the visible Garlic Mustard plants in the city of Camas as per our agreement with the city. However, soil disturbance occurring during this project could move Garlic Mustard seeds into other parcels or other areas, and this movement of seeds could spread the Garlic Mustard infestation.

Please refer to the map below and do not allow any soil that comes from within the yellow boundaries to be moved offsite.

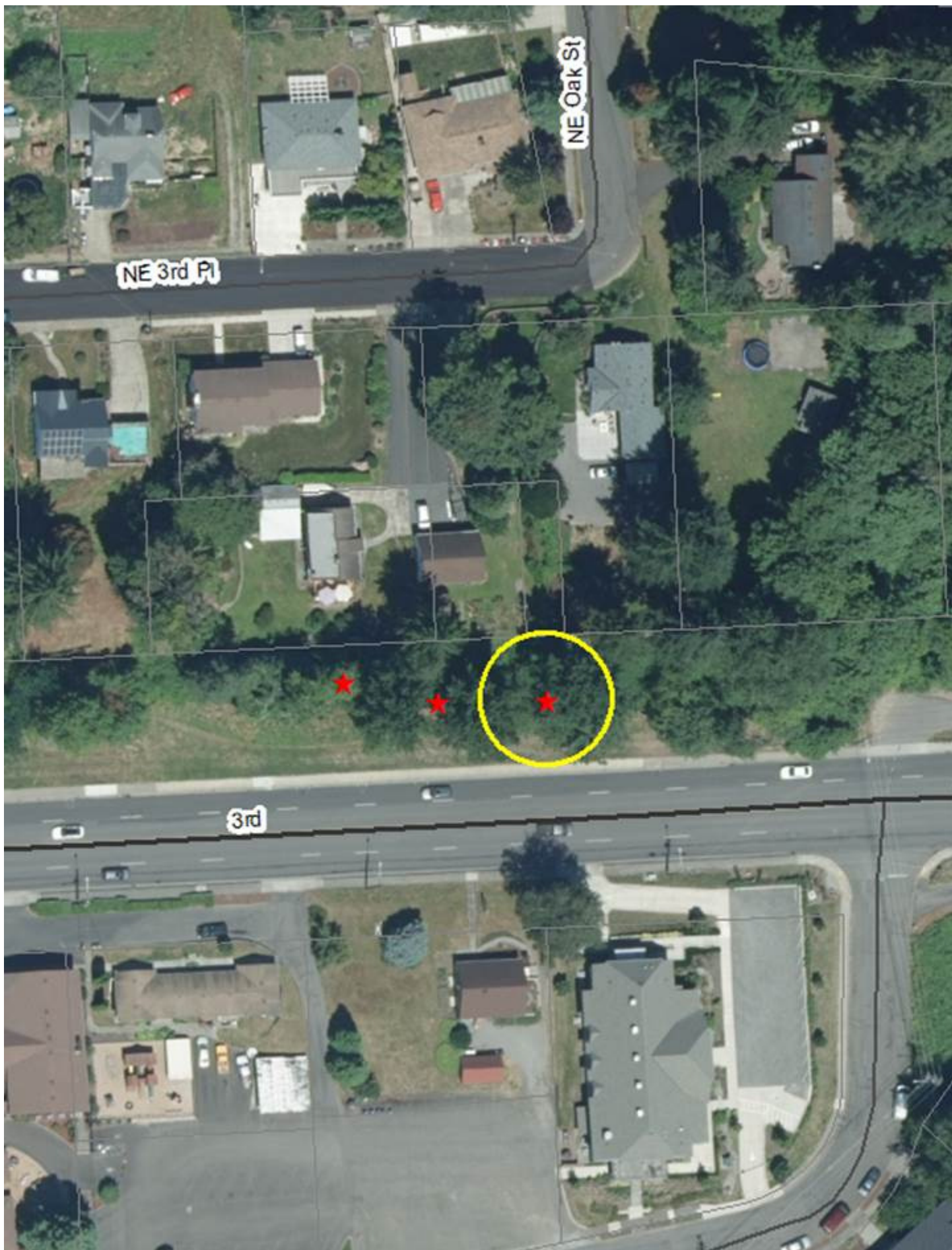

Attached is a SEPA Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) for the **Lacamas Creek Sewer Pump Station (SEPA19-08)** *for your review and comment.*

Request: The applicant is proposing to remove and replace an old sewer pump station and associated piping with two new sewer pump stations and associated piping near Lacamas Creek. Phase 2 improvements include the construction of a restroom facility, pedestrian sidewalk, stormwater swale and paving the existing gravel parking lot at the Lacamas Creek Trailhead Park.
